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T4P All-Site Meeting

18 April 2024 Summary

Sites and Recruitment

- 46 sites open and 364 patients randomised
 - Welcome to Southampton General Hospital who opened this month and already randomised 2 patients
 - 16 randomisations so far in April so a strong start keep going!

Electronic flags/alerts

- We will be sending round a Google Form shortly to gain more information on the systems used in your trust and whether any practices could be shared with other sites using the same systems for electronic alerts
- Southampton General Hospital
 - Research team notified of patients with platelets <60 on ICU clinical MetaVision system for awareness of potential patients
 - Monitored during day and working really well so far
 - Integrated well with clinical team who put own notes on MetaVision that patient is in a research trial and what the threshold is
 - Transfusion team receive email from research when patient randomised junior team taking requests in lab so may not be able to challenge adherence, research team to monitor
- Hampshire Hospitals
 - o Research team email and call transfusion team once a patient is randomised
 - Flag for threshold put on the lab WinPath system (flag removed when patient discharged from ICU)
 - o Discussed in daily lab huddle
- University Hospital Coventry
 - Currently do not use electronic alert but put card on patients with low platelets so team aware when screening
 - o Transferring to EPR System in June so will see how this could work with alerts
- Oxford University Hospitals
 - Use the ICCA system to access reports for patient platelet count and flag on ward rounds any who may become eligible
- Stoke Mandeville Hospital
 - Use ICCA system to run queries for patients with platelets <50 in last 7 days and flag to PI and research team
 - Text clinical team with patients to highlight on ward rounds who may become eligible and ring blood bank to confirm when a patient is randomised – blood bank keep note on their system

- City Hospital, Nottingham
 - NerveCentre system used on wards/ITU note on system so clinical team aware of trial when looking at patient's daily treatment notes
 - o Research nurse adds note on ICU daily medical notes
 - CareFlow alert system used by clinical staff and the lab to be alerted of randomisation threshold
 - o Senior members of transfusion team emailed randomisation to disseminate to wider lab
- University Hospital Lewisham
 - o Currently no alerts set up, but heamatology would do this rather than the transfusion team
